Many organizations review their progress and needs quarterly. This gives them a fresh look at where they have been and where they want to go. As I think back over the first quarter of 2017, I am encouraged about where God is moving Central in the days to come.

As the pastors have meet routinely for staff meetings, discipleship has flourished in our hearts and desires. Progressing the body of Christ in the same model as set forth by Jesus has been on our mind. To that direction, God directed us to lead in teaching Central the heart of God for discipleship. To many, hopefully, it was a timely reminder. To some, it would have been a needed understanding.

What was that reminder and understanding? It was to live life in such a way that each of our lives press the image of Christ upon others. By all indications, it seems Central is desirous of partnering with Love INC to increase our involvement in the immediate area. We'll need to affirm this desire as a body if that is truly our intention. At the same time, our Women's Ministry, the WMU, became increasingly active in formulating and engaging in ministry under Lea Ann Burdette's leadership in concert with her council of ladies. The Eggstravaganza was a huge success in bringing the community into the hearing of the gospel. This was just one of the varied ministries being led by the WMU with the affirmation of Central's Missions Committee. Of course, our active and engaged Student Ministry under the leadership of the creative and winsome Pastor Shannon England made many impacts in and around our church as they joined in Love INC's initiatives to LOVE BREVARD by serving the community in concert with many other area churches.

I could go on to name more activities of ministry that worked to disciple others; Sunday School in the week to week teaching, Men in Motion as an ongoing Gospel work, Choirs as performance takes place only rooted in truth, Nursery as loving hands convey the love of Jesus to children and parents alike. Do you see what I see? We have, and are seeking opportunities to impress our lives in Christ upon others. As we do so, may we be sensitive to the Living Spirit of God to engage in His work as He leads us.

So, what lies ahead? That is what we as a body answers as we listen and learn from the Father. What points of engagement is God opening up for us? What paths of equipping is God directing us down? How can we empower leaders to lead and enjoin ourselves to each other as we serve? These are the crucial questions that are perpetually presented. And they needfully be asked and answered repeatedly. That is what keeps us drawn to the Father and dependent upon Him in everything.

Victorious Living

As I sit here contemplating what to write, it is the day after Easter 2017. Two particular lyrics have been running through my mind since the wonderful celebration of Easter. The first lyric is from the song, "Because He Lives (Amen)" written by Matt Maher with some lyrics borrowed from Bill and Gloria Gather.

Because He lives, I can face tomorrow.

Because He lives, every fear is gone.

I know He holds my life, my future in His hands.

Amen, Amen! I'm alive; I'm alive because He lives.

Amen, Amen! Let my song join the one that never ends because He lives.

It is easy to lose Easter Sunday's victorious outlook on a mundane Monday. However, Jesus remains alive! The grave continues to be empty. He is still victorious over sin, death, and hell and so are we, his children. The apostle Paul wrote to assure us that our salvation is secured because of Jesus' completed work of salvation. In Romans 8, Paul writes, "Therefore, no condemnation now exists for those in Christ Jesus, because the Spirit's law of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death." (8:1-2) He continues, "And if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, then He who raised Christ from the dead will also bring your mortal bodies to life through His Spirit who lives in you." (8:11)

This great section of Scripture begins with the word, "Therefore." A former pastor of mine always reminded us to look back and see what the word therefore is there for. Paul, in the former chapter, candidly confesses that he has trouble doing things that he should, and even enthusiastically engages in those things in which he knows he should not. In the light of these failures, he boldly reminds all Christians that we are no longer condemned. Regardless of our failures, we can anchor our soul knowing we are no longer condemned and can live in the light of the risen Christ. Daniel Henderson adds, "Just as a helium balloon transcends the law of gravity, so the indwelling power of the Spirit frees us from the condemnation and power of sin's rule in our lives." We can live with that victorious outlook every day! It is not dependent upon us, but on the never-changing, all-powerful, promise of the Word of God. We indeed have VICTORY in JESUS. Yes, that is the second song lyric that has been stuck in my head:

O victory in Jesus, my Savior forever,
He sought me and bought me with His redeeming blood;
He loved me ere I knew Him, and all my love is due Him,
He plunged me to victory, beneath the cleansing flood.

Eugene M. Bartlett, Sr. was an important person in the development of Southern Gospel music, and shaped-note singing in the south. Although he wrote over 800 songs, "Victory in Jesus", his last composition, was by far his most well known and loved. After suffering a stroke that left him partially paralyzed and bed-ridden, knowing he was nearing the end of his earthly existence, in 1941 amidst all the uncertainty of the world, he penned these powerful words of assurance and victory.

My friend, don't let the cares of this world rob you of the victorious life we have in Jesus Christ. Whether you are facing a mundane Monday, or struggling with the uncertainty of the future, trust in Him who has overcome this world. (John 16:33)

Praise the Lord! We can live every day in the assurance of the resurrection.

Hide and Seek

When Victoria and Landon were toddlers (12 years apart), I would play hide and seek with them. Often I would hide from them so they could experience the joy of searching. At first I might have to make noises, giving hints so they might not become discouraged in the search. And of course the joy expressed in the finding is indescribable. When they found me they would shout it out with a great squeal, "I FOUND YOU!!" I would encourage them expressing what a great job they did in the search, never giving up. Hide and seek is a lot of fun – there's fun in the hiding, the search, and the discovery. That's also true in our relationship with our Father in Heaven, "*It is the glory of God to conceal things, but the glory of kings is to search things out.*" Proverbs 25:2

For as long as I can remember, I have been captivated by this verse partly because it was life changing for me as a young man and secondly, because it continues to be an encouragement for me as well as a resource for wisdom. In regard to being life changing, I used to be frustrated by the mysteries of God and all the unanswered questions I held. A much wiser, older, friend and mentor shared this passage with me reminding me that God does not conceal things from me out of meanness or cruelty but for the joy of the search and the discovery. Since that day, I have found this Proverb to be a great resource of wisdom.

Here's the deal. God is our creator, all knowing and His wisdom is infinite in ALL things. God is constantly moving and is constantly working in our lives and in His creation without seeking the council of others. He has no need for council because He is God. On the other hand, Kings do not have infinite wisdom and therefore should only act, move and make decisions only after careful consideration of godly council. It would be foolish for a created king with limited knowledge to lead pretending to be as wise as God. The greatest king would be a king who seeks the council of others for the benefit of the kingdom.

While we don't live in a culture of kings here in the US, we are children of God and heirs to His kingdom. Being heirs to his kingdom we have been given much and that includes great responsibility. It is so important in today's culture to seek godly council on a daily basis not pretending to be as wise as God. Please pray for me, that I will do just that. Please pray that daily, I will seek godly council in His word, through His Spirit, and among His people. I will pray the same for the church and Spiritual leaders.

Finally, consider the things God has concealed through His Son, Jesus. Remember, it is His glory to conceal things. Some things He has concealed so they might be searched out. Others He has concealed and hidden as far as the east is from the west. By His grace and in His glory, our Father has concealed our sins paying a debt that we couldn't possibly pay. It is our glory to discover the mystery of Christ Jesus and the fullness of life we have in Him, "My purpose is that they may be encouraged in heart and united in love, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely, Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge". Colossians 2:2-3

You and our church will be on mission for Christ in our neighborhood. (2 Cor. 5:14-15)



Ark Encounter Tour

Well, it's finally springtime and as promised in August of last year we have recently announced a church wide tour to the Ark Encounter and the Creation Museum in Northern Kentucky. Unfortunately, the tour itself is not until the last week in September which is nearly six months later than planned; but as they say in horse shoes and hand grenades, "close enough". As a matter of fact it will be much better because many



more inside exhibits and outside additions will be installed and in place by the time we get there. The weather at that time averages around 70 degrees with fall beginning to fill the air; a welcome relief from the Florida summer which will still be raging when we leave.

The Ark Encounter tour is church-wide and open to all who have a desire to go. So invite your friends and family members to go with you for an encounter they will not soon forget. We have also reached out to other churches in our community as well to invite them to go with us. Experiencing this adventure as a church will have a special impact to our fellowship; just ask the many who have already gone on their own since it opened on July 7 of last year.

The specific dates for the tour are September 24 through September 30 and include transportation, hotel and admission to the Ark Encounter, Creation Museum, Cincinnati Zoo and the Newport Aquarium. Many of the tour's meals are also included and the cost is very affordable at \$659 per person which also includes the tips for the bus driver. A small \$75 deposit is required to reserve your seat and is due by May 21. Seats are on a first-come, first-serve basis so don't procrastinate and miss the opportunity. The Creation Museum and Ark Encounter are two Christian themed attractions that are owned and operated by Answers in Genesis (AiG). AiG is an apologetics ministry dedicated to helping Christians defend their faith and proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ effectively. They focus particularly on providing answers to questions surrounding the book of Genesis, as it is the most-attacked book of the Bible. They also desire to train others to develop a biblical worldview, and seek to expose the bankruptcy of man's evolutionary-based ideas, and its bedfellow, a "millions of years old" earth (and even older universe).

AiG teaches that "facts" don't speak for themselves, but must be interpreted. That is, there aren't separate sets of "evidences" for evolutionary ideas and creation—we all deal with the same evidence (we all live on the same earth, have the same fossils, observe the same animals, etc.). The difference lies in how we interpret what we study. The Bible—the "true history book of the universe"—provides a reliable, eye-witness account of the beginning of all things, is the ultimate authority and can be trusted to tell the truth in all areas on which it touches. Therefore, we are able to use it to help us make sense of this present world. When properly understood, the "evidence" confirms the biblical account.

In our culture today, where a secular world view is predominate and continues to invade the mind of the believer, the family, the church, as well as corporate and government institutions, AiG's ministry is to work to develop a solid Biblical world view with both Christians and non-Christians alike by upholding the authority of God's Word over the wisdom of man and proclaiming the Gospel in all things. They do this by several elements of their ministry;

- AiG produces teaching materials in the form of books, DVDs, curriculum in various forms including Sunday School and VBS as well as single semester topics all available in their on-line store. They have thousands of articles and many other apologetics resources that are available online and easy to find using their powerful resource search engine.
- AiG has a staff of PhD scientists who are constantly working to continue scientific research in all the sciences (biology, geology, astronomy, archeology and paleontology) from a biblical world view that confirms the history of the Bible is true instead of the bankrupt secular evolutionary world view.
- AiG has a large speaking ministry involving a plethora of speakers both full time and adjunct to reach out to churches and other Christian organizations including home school groups, conferences and conventions to speak on various apologetic topics.
- The Creation Museum opened in 2007 that displays the results of their extensive biblical and scientific research and includes a chronological walk thru the Bible leading to the Gospel message based on the Seven C's roadmap (Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross and Consummation).
- The latest venue is the Ark Encounter; a Christian themed attraction built to biblical scale and includes over 132 exhibits (over 300,000 sq. ft.) to address the skeptical questions of the age related to the true history of the universe as recorded in Genesis that further helps believers to develop a more solid biblical world view.
- They employ hundreds of historical, theological, and scientific researchers as well as skilled artists and craftsmen to accomplish these ministry outreach projects given above.

Self Defense Through Tactical Shooting & Decision Making

The Brevard County Sheriff's Office offers a "Self Defense Through Tactical Shooting & Decision Making" course. This eight hour course is designed to give civilians the opportunity to learn safe gun handling skills as well as the legal aspects of gun ownership. The course is in four parts:

Part 1 - Sheriff Wayne Ivey will speak on Self Defense Through Mental Preparedness

Part 2 - State Attorney Phil Archer will speak on the Law-Stand Your Ground and the Castle Doctrine

Part 3 - Tactical Shooting/Weapon Retention/Firearms Safety

Part 4 - Shoot, Don't Shoot Scenarios

Upon completion of this course, you will receive a certificate as verification of training that satisfies the state training requirement to acquire your Concealed Weapons License from the State of Florida.

Requirements & Other Information

- Must be 21 years of age and pass a background check
- Serviceable unloaded handgun (no sharing, no Title II, NFA or assault weapons)
- 100 rounds of factory ammunition (no re-loads)
- Eye protection, ear protection and hat
- Inclement weather gear (recommended)
- Registration is \$75.00 (check or money order) and is non refundable.

By the 20th century, competing Union and Confederate holiday traditions, celebrated on different days, had merged, and Memorial Day eventually extended to honor all Americans who died while in the military service. It marks the start of the unofficial summer vacation season, while Labor Day marks its end.

Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, particularly to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers place an American flag on each grave in national cemeteries.
