Your gifts transform lives around the world. There are over 2,800,000,000 people who have never heard the hope of the gospel. But together through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering and Week of Prayer in 2017, we can harness each dollar possible to reach them. The International Mission Board has partnered with Southern Baptists to send 3,500 missionaries into global cities and hard-to-access places all over the world. Compelled by the urgent spiritual need, we go to places only reached on foot, by boat, or on horseback. We give our lives to serve in high-rise apartments and places without roads, hospitals, and air conditioners. As we partner together, we take hope to corners of the globe that have never heard the name of Jesus.

We reach business people in Mexico City as IMB missionaries who share hope over coffee. We meet refugees from North Africa, introduce them to the gospel, and lead them to life for the first time. We contact Muslims in Russia who are moving from the mountains into major cities and are open to learning about Jesus. We serve earthquake victims in Nepal and let them experience the love of Christ through volunteers who hike four days to get to their devastated villages. We build relationships with young moms in Japan and let them see examples of IMB families where Jesus changed their homes and lives.



As months turned into weeks and weeks turned into days, 48 excited people anxiously met early on Sunday morning September 24 and boarded the *Magic Carpet Ride* (bus company), which began the long anticipated Ark Encounter tour. First announced in May of this year and in the planning stages since February, the actual day of departure finally arrived and off we went to the Northern Kentucky area to visit the much anticipated Ark Encounter and Creation Museum Christian themed attractions. These sister attractions are evangelistic outreach entities of the world’s largest apologetics ministry which seeks to equip the church to uphold the authority and accuracy of the Bible from the very first verse; thereby enabling it to more effectively present the gospel to our increasingly secular evolutionary culture. For this reason, our group was headed north.

Logistics of the tour were organized by Diamond Tours who, by the way, report that the Ark Encounter is the number one family attraction destination for their company in 2017 and forecast as well for 2018.

The demographics of our group consisted mostly of CBC folks but we had a good size group of people from FBC and several others from surrounding churches as far away as Rockledge including, Lutheran, Methodist, Calvary Chapel

and several other community churches. Ages ranged from teenage through senior adult but all had one thing in common, they wanted to experience the Ark Encounter they had heard so much about.

After spending two days of travel time to get to the Cincinnati area, there was a collective gasp as Karen and I pointed out the top of the Ark structure from the bus as we sped by it on I-75 on the way to our Cincinnati hotel, realizing it was over a mile away from the interstate. It’s one thing to read about the size of the Ark in the biblical narrative but to see it from a distance and then close up later on boggles the mind. Sometimes it is difficult to process the reality of what we see with an inaccurate perspective of what we read, a conflict that many people are

confronted with about the Ark's size. Those who were witnesses to this encounter will have a totally new perspective of the biblical Ark and the true historical accounts of the Bible and its authority over man's ideas.

The four days of travel time up there and back were not left to be consumed by the normal road games and casual conversation to make the time go quicker. An itinerary of scheduled teaching videos by AiG speakers and researchers to prepare the group for what they would experience and to maximize their encounter experience ranged from

Ken Ham, Dr. Andrew Snelling, Bodie Hodge, Tim Lovett and Eric Hovind to name a few. Their themes centered around the importance of the authority of God's Word over man's word as related to a variety of subjects. The recently released documentary "Is Genesis History?" by Del Tackett was also shown that again demonstrated that science affirms the historical accounts in the Bible which can be trusted to be accurate, reliable and authoritative.


Staying in a Cincinnati area hotel, we spent three days at four different attractions. The first day was spent at the world's famous Cincinnati Zoo and the Newport Aquarium, followed by the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum on day two and three. Two days split between these two Christian themed destinations is not nearly enough time to digest their world class exhibits and their content, but there was plenty left behind to see on a future return trip.

The massive ship at the Ark Encounter, over 510 feet long and 10 stories high at its peak, was completely overwhelming as it came into view when we first arrived. Gazing at this gigantic structure took some time to get beyond. But what lay beyond were the three decks of exhibits illustrating biblical truth, the scientific research affirming that truth and the gospel message based on that truth demonstrated in various different forms and venues. Other amenities included the book store and gift shop (including Uncle Leroy's Fudge), the 1500 seat Emzara's Kitchen, numerous eateries inside and around the campus, the Queue Line Garden, the West and East Villages, the Screaming Eagle Zip Lines and the Ararat Ridge Zoo including camel rides that several of our ladies decided to experience. The day went by very fast with so much to see and experience but so much was left behind for another time.

The Creation Museum was a completely different experience with the main exhibit hall laid out in chronological sequence based on AiG's 7 C's of biblical history; Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross and Consummation. There was the first class Stargazers Planetarium with two different shows, two live presentations by AiG speakers, workshops, several theaters with evangelistic presentations, Noah's Café, the beautiful Botanical Gardens, Screaming Raptors Zip Lines, Petting Zoo, and two bookstores and gift shops (and more Uncle Leroy's Fudge). That day was also tiring and the end came quickly as we said goodbye to this great ministry that God has raised up to



return His Church to the authority of His Word. It was also the last day before we started our two day journey back home. While at the Creation Museum, Karen and I were very fortunate to also get to see many of our AiG ministry partners again that we have come to know over the many years of involvement with the AiG ministry. The Creation Museum also serves as the AiG headquarters. Some scheduling changes prevented our group from having a meet and greet with Ken Ham after the live **Answers News** web cast, but one person in our group, Andrew Lawson, got to personally meet with Ken in his office who spoke with Andrew as well as signed his recently purchased best seller book, *The Lie*.

Be sure to ask Andrew how that all came about and how excited he was to receive this surprise and honor to meet one of his heroes of the faith. He will be more than happy to share his experience with you and give you the whole story.

At the end of each day our tired group was treated to one of several great restaurants in the area. In particular was a favorite of the locals called *The Farm* where the owner gave the crowd in attendance that night an overview of the history of Cincinnati and closed with a great testimony to the work God has done in his life. That was a first time experience for me as was most of us and, oh yeah, the food was delicious too.

Take it from the 48 people that went on this tour, you don't want to miss out on these two world-class attractions, the Creation Museum and the Ark Encounter. Please pray that God would be glorified and that many people would come and see that the Bible can be trusted from the very beginning. Also pray that guests will understand that, as the door of the Ark provided Noah and his family an entrance into physical safety from the Flood, it is Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, who is the door to eternal salvation.




